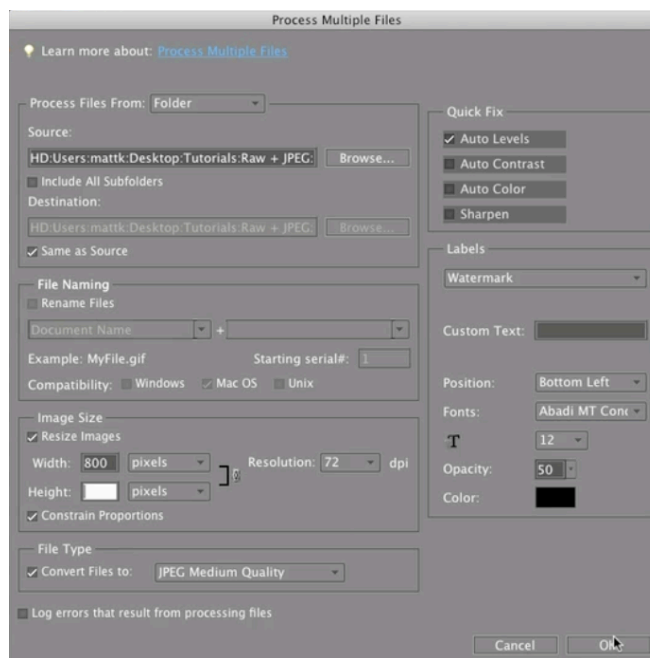

Don't Shoot Raw+JPEG: Process Multiple Files Instead

A quick video about why shooting just Raw in your camera can be beneficial and how to export them as JPEGs using the Process Multiple Files command.

1. Go to the **File** menu and select **Process Multiple Files**.
2. Under **Process Files From**, select **Folder**.
3. Click the **Browse** button to select the source folder (which photos you'll be converting from Raw to JPEG).
4. Choose the **Destination** of the new JPEG files. (Helpful Hint: By checking the **Same as Source** box, your JPEGs will end up in the same folder as

your original Raw files with the same file names. If you'd like to have them in a separate folder, create that folder prior to this step.)

5. If you'd like to rename your new JPEGs, check the **Rename Files** box (if you have the Same as Source box checked, this option won't be allowed). You have multiple file naming options, including new document names and sequence numbers.
6. If you'd like to resize your images, check the **Resize Images** box. Make sure the **Constrain Proportions** box is checked and type in a new width, height and/or resolution. (Helpful Hint: If you plan on automatically updating your JPEGs to the internet, try using a width or height of less than 900 pixels and a resolutions of 72 or 96.)
7. Under **File Type**, check the **Convert Files To** box and select your new file type.
